## **How to assign color to your bar code using Bar Code Pro 4.0 for Macintosh**

Revised: 7-18-01

To achieve a perfect color match, simply follow the directions below.

1. In your desktop publishing program (PageMaker, Quark, etc.), look up the **CMYK** values that your Pantone color is comprised of. Write down those percentage along with the exact spacing, capitilization and spelling of the color name e.g. Pantone 293CVC.

2. Launch Bar Code Pro.

In the **Edit Color** menu, you can manually change your colors by renaming the **Bars/Text** color and entering **Cyan, Magenta, Yellow** and **Black** values accordingly.

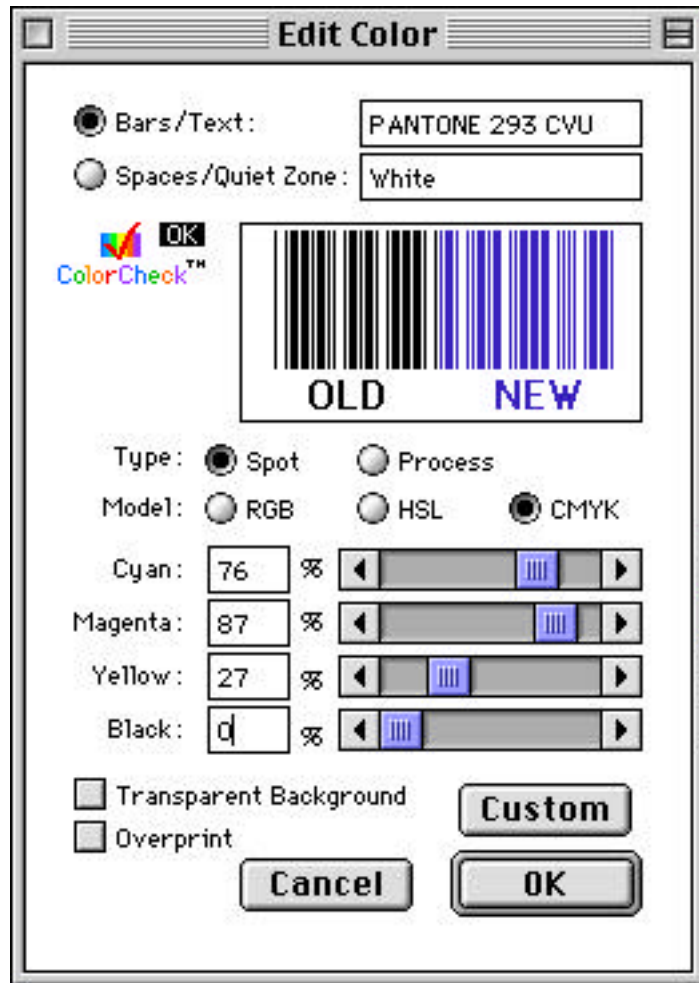
Manually enter your Pantone color in **Bars/Text**. **Be sure to enter it exactly as it's spelled (including spaces and capitalization)**.

Enter the color **White** in: **Spaces/Quiet Zones** for a plain white background.

Select **Spot** or **CMYK** (depending on your job)

Manually enter the color percentages taken from your desktop publishing document in the **Cyan**, **Magenta**, **Yellow** and **Black** boxes:

(Enter the exact percentage values of your Pantone colors.)



3. Once you have finished with your settings, click **OK**.

4. Save your bar code and replace the one in your document with the new one. Then print.
